Trinity Methodist Church

If you come through the back door of Trinity Fartown Methodist Church on Spaines Road on a Tuesday morning at about 10.30 you can have a cup of tea. Well, that could happen in many places – but here you may also find yourself surrounded by people speaking many different languages - quite likely Urdu, Arabic or Polish or any one of 10 or so others. It is the refreshment break for the free ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) classes that are held here every Tuesday in term time, and people are either continuing to practise their English with the volunteers, or grabbing a few minutes to relax and talk in their own language until the class starts again.

There are, at the moment, five classes – beginners, intermediate, and advanced, with a more advanced conversation group and a small group practising for IELTs examinations; each taking place in a separate room. A team of about 12 volunteers, the majority qualified teachers, run the classes, with professional advice given by a qualified and experienced Esol teacher. Numbers have steadily grown since September 2014, when we started with 10 students – now we usually have well over 30, as students come back and telling their friends.

The volunteer teachers love their work: it is

hard work but rewarding. 'You given confidence' have us students told one teacher. A explained how student children are beginning to respect her more, now that she can understand what their homework is. In the beginners' class there is of laughter misunderstanding gives way to an 'aah!' of recognition, both on the part of the students and the teachers – for example when the teacher found out that one student had not one child and

three wives, but one wife and three children! It isn't all about English either: before Christmas two students prepared a talk on customs in their country for a concert at Bradley Court housing scheme, giving them a chance to practise public speaking and providing some great entertainment for the elderly at the same time. At Christmas some of the students organised a fantastic Christmas party for over 50 children of students and their families – we are hoping to put on another party for Easter. getting a crèche established so women can bring their pre-school children. At the end of most terms we share a meal or hold a party. In the summer we give out certificates of attendance.

As a church we are happy to know we are serving the local community, making the church a place where many people feel welcome and at home, and helping friendships grow between people from very different cultures. If you want to improve your English, or you know someone else who does; if you have some spare time on Tuesday mornings and enjoy looking after small children; or if you have some experience teaching and would like to get involved, do get in touch; we would love to see you.

CONFLICT RESOLUTIONS



The Conflict Resolution Project proved to be an overwhelming success. Demand for this project exceeded all levels of expectation.

Conflicts in society is at unprecedented high, especially amongst young people. The project helped and supported young people in a number of ways, these area's included how to resolve conflicts, how to avoid conflicts, how to avoid Gangs with a strong anti-gang message, social media awareness, cyber bullying, social skills, people skills, cultural diversity awareness, respect issues, attitude issues, education and community cohesion.

We took the project into various Centre's throughout Huddersfield and went into various Junior and High Schools in Huddersfield and Bradford.

The response was phenomenal in every school we visited and as well as the pupils learning from the project all the teachers said they learned something also and want us to come back into all the schools in the new term.

Now is the time to tidy up borders, cut back any dead growth and tackle weeds

- Weeds will come back into growth deal with them before they get out of hand.
- Chemical weedkillers are a very efficient way of getting rid of weeds especially otherwise difficult to control, deep-rooted perennial weeds.
- Select a weedkiller for specific weeding tasks to give you the weed control you need.
- Dig in a layer of manure or compost to prepare the ground for planting.
- Top dress your containers and borders with an inch or two of new compost each season.
- The compost will break down and help improve the soil structure and fertility.

Using the correct type of compost will give the best results, eg, use a lime free ericaceous compost for acid loving plants such as rhododendrons, azaleas and camellias.

Planting

Decide on the look and feel you want for your garden before you begin planting. You could try a traditional, contemporary, cottage style, or even Mediterranean look for your garden.

- Plants are hungry after a long winter without any feed. Choose from liquid feeds, granular feeds, continuous release feeds or specialist plant feeds for specific plant types.
- Garden compost and farmyard manure added to the soil will also supply some plant nutrients.
- In early spring, seedlings and young plants are particularly vulnerable to slugs, so concentrate your efforts on preventing these types of plants being damaged.

Scatter slug pellets* thinly around vulnerable plants, such as seedlings, vegetables and young shoots on herbaceous plants. *Follow manufactures instructions

Lawn Treatment

- Start getting your lawn into shape mow the grass, feed with a lawn fertiliser and deal with bare patches, ugly weeds and moss.
- Correct and regular mowing is essential. Cut the grass whenever it is growing - weekly or even more frequently as the weather warms up.

Feed with a lawn fertiliser, not only makes the grass greener, but it makes it grow thicker and stronger so it is more robust and better equipped to compete with weeds and moss.










The Elderberry Club





WHAT A SURPRISE !!!!!!

You don't often open a national magazine and see a photo of yourself and a write-up

The photo is of Ruth Bower together with mum Isobel Bannister who are both members of the Elderberry Club

Here is an extract from the full page article together with the photo....

'A Huddersfield Club that brings together older people who enjoy the company of others has won a £500 grant.

The Elderberry club is one of 40 community organisations that will share £20,000 from the Skipton Building Society's Grassroots Giving Scheme.

Conceived in 2008 by two Methodist Churches in Cowcliffe and Fartown, the Elderberry Club helps lonely, elderly and disabled people mostly over 70 (with some in their 90s) to mix and enjoy themselves.

Meeting monthly, it provides a variety of social activities including crafts, talks, games and films with occasional treats like afternoon teas and meals out and shows etc.'

David Cutter, Skipton Building Society's Chief Executive, said:....."Often small groups are out on a limb and struggle to gain funding from elsewhere, as they are not registered charities. Grassroots Giving scheme enables us to get to the heart of our local communities and we love being able to help causes that we see in action in our local neighbourhoods."

The Elderberry club was in receipt of the money from the above building society as it managed to reach the short list of votes cast in its favour in a national initiative successfully taken up on behalf of the club by Winifred Barron who is on the committee. The money has been used to help purchase blackout blinds in the Coffee Lounge at Fartown so that films can be shown more effectively.

We are currently planning a good range of events for the rest of the year (including films) which are roughly once a month at either church and sometimes at other venues.

As you probably already know the grant was put towards the green blinds in the Coffee Lounge and Winifred has sent a photograph or two to the Skipton Building Society



Blue badge scam

Don't get caught out by some online websites that are charging up to £50 to complete a blue badge application, when to apply is free. The badge will only cost £10 if the application is successful.

If the web address doesn't end in Gov.uk then its not an official government website and is likely to be a scam.

Buying Tickets Online

Be aware if you find a website advertised via email or social

media offering you the chance to buy tickets to a popular concert/event. Fraudsters create their own bogus ticket companies to advertise tickets that have either already sold out or haven't officially gone on sale yet.

When buying concert tickets online, buy only from official sources such as the venue's box office, the promoter, an official agent or a well-known and reputable ticket exchange site.

Money Mules

Money mules are recruited, sometimes un-wittingly, by criminals to transfer illegally obtained money between different bank accounts. Money mules receive the stolen funds into their account, they are then asked to withdraw it and wire the money to a different account, often one overseas, keeping some of the money for themselves. There's a high chance that mules won't receive any of the money they've been promised.

Even if you're unaware that the money you're transferring was illegally obtained, you have played an important role in fraud and money laundering and can still be prosecuted.



Netflix Scam

An email scam has been targeting Netflix subscribers, hoping to gather personal information and payment details.

The scam tells customers that their billing details with Netflix has been invalidated and to immediately update

their information on their website. They give a web link that is NOT the official Netflix site.

Can Care Navigation make a difference for you?

The Care Navigation team at Kirklees Council helps adults with social care needs, or their carers, find health and social care support in their communities.

Care Navigators have their own areas to work in so have a good local knowledge of what's available in communities, such as lunch clubs, social groups, exercise groups and support groups. They work with people to help them find support with their day to day lives including equipment, shopping, transport and cleaning. They can support people to find organisations that can advise on debt problems, benefits and housing, and more!

Care Navigators can help people to build a support package that is tailored to their needs.

Support can come from health care providers, sports and leisure facilities or from voluntary and community groups. They can help people find free or alternative support, as well as care services for people who have a budget to spend.

Care Navigators can support people and their carers who have had an assessment of their needs, who are eligible for a personal budget, to arrange their own personalised support to enhance the quality of their lives. They can also help people decide how they want to spend their personal budget, if they would like Kirklees to provide their support, or if a direct payment would suit them better. Direct payments would allow them to choose their own provider or maybe employ a personal assistant. The team can provide the same advice and support to help people who decide not to have an assessment and want to pay for their own support to arrange the support that they want, using their specialised knowledge of what is available.
